Statement submission for the Thurston Neighbourhood Area -

Please accept this as the formal application for the Thurston Neighbourhood Plan. The application is submitted by Thurston Parish Council who will be the lead in taking the project forward.

The proposal attracted 100% support at a public meeting held 16th May 2013. The Steering Group, yet to be formed, will comprise of some Councillors, along with residents and business owners with varying skills, knowledge and experience.

Thurston is a mainly residential parish, with a Primary School, a Community College, a Preschool, 2 small business parks and other individual businesses, farms, and organisations. The access road to junction 46 of the east-bound A14 is in Thurston, with the corresponding exit junction just 2 miles or so away, in Beyton. There is also a Railway Station in the village, and Bury St Edmunds is some 3 to 4 miles away.

The current Parish Council consists of 11 seats. Five members elected at the May 2011 elections are still in place, with 5 co-opted onto the Council since then, and currently 1 vacant seat. The movement in membership has been a challenge to the project, but the current Council has a more than adequate variety of necessary skills etc., and an extremely positive approach towards safeguarding Thurston's future development.

The Council responded to the District Council's concern that local businesses, residents etc should be a part of the production of the Plan, and successfully sought their support at the above-mentioned public meeting. All agreed that the area covered by the Plan should be the Parish boundary.

Volunteers to become involved are currently making themselves, and their interest and skills/knowledge etc, known to the Council, and from among them the Council will form a fully-effective Steering Group.

Given the proximity of the A14 and the Railway Station. The Council is very aware that Thurston will be a target for development at some point in the future, and seeks to have an input as to the nature of such development, drawn from forging new skills in integrating the community; motivating organisations and individuals to become involved; identifying skills and resources needed, and identifying the need and nature of help required from organisations such as Mid Suffolk District Council, Suffolk County Council and others.

THURSTON PARISH COUNCIL NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN STEERING COMMITTEE TERMS OF REFERENCE

1: Background:

Neighbourhood Plans will give local people much greater say to shape development in their area.

The Neighbourhood Plan must be in line with the wider ambitions for growth and sustainability in the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) and Local Development Plan (LDP) for Mid Suffolk

Thurston Parish Council has established a working group to oversee the initial stages of preparing a Neighbourhood Plan, and is in the process of forming a steering committee to oversee the process of preparing a Neighbourhood Plan for the Thurston Parish, and to report to the Parish Council.

2: Purpose and Mission Statement

The purpose of the steering committee is to develop and oversee a process that will result in the preparation of a Neighbourhood Plan for Thurston in order to:

Preserve and enhance the built, natural, and historical environment of the local area and the character of Thurston whilst allowing for sustainable economic and social growth and development.

The process will be:

- Inclusive offering the opportunity to participate for everyone who lives or works in Thurston.
- Comprehensive identifying all important aspects of life in Thurston for which we need to plan for the future including affordable housing.
- Positive bringing forward proposals which will improve the quality of life in Thurston.

3: Tasks

The working group will:

Prepare an outline process for the initial stages of producing the Neighbourhood Plan.

The steering committee will then:

- Assess existing evidence about the needs and aspirations of the Parish.
- Engage with everyone who lives and works in Thurston to provide information on the Neighbourhood Plan and the reasons for adopting the final plan.
- Work closely with Mid Suffolk District Council and agree a project timetable and delivery plan ensuring compliance with legal requirements.
- Agree a project communication, consultation and engagement strategy.
- Ensure that there is transparency throughout the delivery process
- Approve all consultation documents prior to publication
- Analyse the views, ideas and proposals received during the planning process and use them to prepare the draft plan.
- Work with Mid Suffolk District Council to ensure compliance/conformity of the final plan in parallel with the LDP & NPPF.

- Actively publicise the Neighbourhood Plan prior to the referendum.
- Keep Thurston Parish Council fully informed of progress and present steering committee minutes.

4: Membership and Quorum

Membership of the steering committee shall be drawn up from Thurston Parish Council and interested parties living or working in the Parish. It shall also include Thurston Parish Clerk and a Planning Officer from Mid Suffolk district Council.

Membership of the group shall comprise no more than 14 persons of which no more than 7 voting members shall be from the Parish Council.

The steering committee will be quorum when one third of the members are present.

5: Current Membership of the working group

Councillor Stuart Campbell Councillor Richard Fawcett Kathryn Savage (Parish Clerk) Non-Voting

When the steering committee is formed, it shall elect a Chairperson and Deputy Chairperson from their number. If the Chairperson is not present the Deputy Chair shall take over.

The steering committee shall extend until the Neighbourhood Plan has been assessed and approved by the independent examiner. The steering committee shall pass the draft Neighbourhood Plan to Mid Suffolk District Council for approval prior to independent examination.

6: Support Officers and Administration

The non voting advisory officers shall be the Clerk to the Council and the Mid Suffolk Planning Support Officer.

The Clerk to the Parish Council shall ensure that appropriate clerking arrangements are in hand for steering committee meetings.

Notice and associated papers shall normally be despatched three clear days before the date of the meeting by e-mail and the minutes to be publicised, recorded and open to the public.

7: Frequency, Timing and Procedure of meetings

The steering committee shall meet not less than twelve times a year.

Meetings shall be open to the public to observe proceedings.

All meetings shall include the opportunity for public participation.

The Terms of Reference will be approved by the Parish Council

Any changes to the steering committee Terms of Reference shall require Parish Council approval.
